Gingin Landfill Project – Key Milestone Achieved

M8 Sustainable Limited (“M8S”) is pleased to announce that it has completed a key milestone at its flagship Gingin Landfill Project (“Gingin”), receiving official confirmation from the Shire of Gingin that the works undertaken to date by M8S have satisfied the substantial commencement requirement of the development.

The substantial commencement milestone was a critical condition of the WA Government Planning Approval for Gingin. Failure to achieve substantial commencement within the stipulated timeframe, would have resulted in the Planning Approval lapsing and M8S being unable to proceed with the landfill development.

Positive confirmation from the Shire of Gingin now means that planning approval for the Gingin site as a landfill facility is in place for life, without an expiry date.

Major earthworks at the site continue to progress well, with an anticipated completion date of the landfill cell expected to occur by the end of the first quarter of the 2021 calendar year.

Commenting on the successful milestone at Gingin, M8S Managing Director Tom Rudas said, “We are extremely pleased to receive positive confirmation for the substantial commencement at the Gingin Landfill Project.

“We can now focus on advancing key workstreams at Gingin to meet our targeted completion date of the landfill cell by the end of the first quarter of 2021.”
