NOTICES RECEIVED UNDER SECTIONS 203D(2) AND 249D OF THE CORPORATIONS ACT

M8 Sustainable Limited (ASX: M8S) (M8S or the Company) advises that it has received the following notices on 22 December 2022:

- (i) notice under section 203D(2) of the *Corporations Act 2001*(Cth) (the **Act**) from M8 Holding Limited(M8H) giving notice to the Company of its intention to move a resolution at a general meeting of the Company to remove Mr Rodney Illingworth as a director of the Company notice was also received under section 249D of the Act from M8H requesting the Company to convene a general meeting of shareholders for the purpose of considering the resolution outlined above.
- (ii) notice under section 203D(2) of the Act from Adroit Capital Group ESG Pty Ltd as trustee for the Adroit Capital Group ESG Unit Trust giving notice to the Company of its intention to move resolutions at a general meeting of the Company to appoint Mr Malcolm Raymond Scott James and Mr Anthony Nelson Short as directors of the Company; conditional on the appointment of Messrs James and Short as directors, the removal of Mr Tomasz Jacek Rudas, Mr Saithsiri Saksitthisereekul and Mr Damien Flugge as directors of the Company; and conditional on the appointment of Messrs James and Short as directors, the removal of any directors appointed by the Company on or after 22 December 2022 except for Messrs James and Short.

The Directors are reviewing the requisitions to confirm compliance with the Act. Where the requisitions are determined to be in compliance with the Act, the Directors will comply with their obligations in relation to the response to the requisitions and will advise the market accordingly.
